

Dear Dormitory Operator,

Further Expansion of Community and Recreation Centre Visits and Revising of Measures for Dormitory Residents

The Multi-Ministry Taskforce (MTF) announced on 15 November 2021 further expansion of community and Recreation Centre (RC) visits for migrant workers. Ministry of Manpower (MOM) has also revised the measures on sports activities and communal dining for your dormitory residents in line with the recent MTF's announcements.

Communal dining

2. With immediate effect, migrant workers who are fully vaccinated^[1] will be allowed to dine-in in **groups of five** at canteens or communal dining areas.

Community visits

3. From 3 December 2021, MOM will increase the community visits to **3000 workers per day**. Only fully vaccinated workers and recovered workers within 270 days from their COVID-19 infection may apply for an Exit Pass via their SGWorkPass app up to seven days in advance to visit any location in the community. Please check that your residents have a valid Exit Pass and uploaded negative ART result administered within 24 hours from the allocated time slot for the visit before leaving the dormitory.

RC visits

4. From 3 December 2021, all workers will be allowed to visit their designated RC daily for up to eight hours for the allocated timeslot. From mid-December 2021, they will be allowed to visit any RCs of their choice. Please continue to check that your residents have a valid Exit Pass before allowing them to exit the dormitory for RC visits. For unvaccinated residents, please also check if they have uploaded their ART results to the FWMOMCare app.

Vaccination-differentiated approach for progressive easing of restrictions

5. MOM will continue to adopt a Vaccination-Differentiated Safe Management Measures (VDS) for fully vaccinated and unvaccinated/partially vaccinated workers. The list of updated measures can be found in the table below.

6. When organising sports activities, dormitory operators must comply with the existing Safe Management Measures (SMM). Please consult the Forward Assurance and Support Teams (FAST) for any advice or clarifications on the SMM.

TraceTogether Token Machine at RCs

7. We have earlier deployed TraceTogether (TT) token vending machines at the eight RCs for the convenience of residents not staying in dormitories under the Foreign Employees Dormitories Act (FEDA) in exchanging their TT token. We will now allow all residents staying in all dorm types to exchange their faulty TT token or tokens which have ran out of battery at the RCs.

^[1] Received both doses of the Pfizer/BioNTech Comirnaty, Moderna, Sinovac-CoronaVac or other World Health Organisation Emergency Use List vaccines, with an additional two weeks for the vaccine to be fully effective. For persons who have received Sinovac-CoronaVac, they should receive a third dose at least 90 days from their second dose. Persons will need to have received three doses of Sinovac-CoronaVac to be recognised as fully vaccinated from 1 Jan 2022.

^[2] If the worker is ART positive, he will not be allowed to exit the dormitory and is deemed to have used his community Exit Pass. He will only be able to apply for another pass in the next quarter.
